


Example: EU and Member States' ODA from 2022 up to now, as reported to IATI

Sankey diagram


Example: EU and Member States' ODA grants and loans to Africa in 2021, as reported to IATI






Example: European Commission's ODA for Education in 2021

Example: EU and Member States' projects in Brazil from 2017 up to now, as reported to IATI








Collaboration on IATI

Phase 3: Include results reporting and visualization





- A selection of 6 indicators from their total indicator framework are reported in their IATI data:
 - Total investment commitments in projects at financial close (TICs) (\$m)
 - Private sector investment commitments (\$m)
 - Access to new & improved infrastructure
 - Job creation: short-term
 - Job creation: long-term
 - Fiscal benefits (\$m)
- The indicators used for the company group are the same for all projects of the company group, enabling aggregation of results.





Number of short term jobs created (compared to yearly target, quarterly monitoring)






